### *RESPECT .... RESPONSIBILITY .... CARING*



The "Thinkuknow" presentation is on Monday 12 June. Please come along and find out what is happening with your children online. The adults session is from 3pm and will be held in the ICT room.

**This program bridges the knowledge gap between adults and young people so that everyone has an understanding of the roles they play and what they can do if something goes wrong online.**

#### **The Presentation will cover the following:**

What young people **SEE** online:

- We talk about challenges such as online grooming, 'sexting', cyberbullying and inappropriate content.
- What you can do to support young people through online challenges.  
we also explain how to report if something goes wrong.

What young people **SAY** online:

- What you can do to help support young people understand what they say online can be permanent. We call this our 'digital shadow'.

This includes talking about being respectful online, thinking before you post, knowing what information is okay to share online.

What young people **DO** online:

- How they use technology to have fun online, such as applications (or apps), websites and social networks.  
How they can handle their digital shadow, including their privacy and relationships online.

**Students Year 2 - 12 will also be engaged in the program on Monday 12<sup>th</sup>.**

**Also on Monday for Primary students is an incursion called Wake Up and Read. A performance that encourages reading, both for pleasure and research, with positive background messages of multiculturalism, social harmony and anti-bullying. So Monday will be an interesting day for our students.**

## KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS 2018

### ENROLMENTS NOW OPEN

Children must be 4 years old by 30th June in the year they attend the Kindergarten programme. At Kalbarri District High School Kindergarten students attend 2.5 days per week. Actual days will be advised towards the end of this year. Kindergarten is followed by a year of Pre-Primary (five full days per week) and children must be 5 years old by 30th June in the year they attend.

**FRIDAY 21 JULY  
IS AN IMPORTANT  
DATE IN YOUR  
CHILD'S EDUCATION**

You must apply to enrol your child in a public school for 2018 if they are:

- starting Pre-primary (first compulsory year of school) - 5 years old by 30 June 2018
- starting Year 7 (first year of secondary school)
- changing schools.

If your child is 4 years old by 30 June 2018 you can apply to enrol them in Kindergarten for 2018.

### COURT RESURFACE

### YEAR 7/8 COLLABORATIVE MATHS PROJECT

Last week we combined our Year 7 and 8 Maths classes to start work on a collaborative project. The students were grouped into teams and investigated the costs associated with painting their class room. As part of this project students needed to work together to accurately measure the surface area of the walls, research how much paint they will need, use online tools to create a virtual walk-through of the room with their chosen colours, cost paint and other materials from various suppliers and create an accurate quote for the school. This project will run for eight periods and is providing students with an opportunity to collaborate and share their knowledge to solve problems. One aspect of the Australian Maths Curriculum is Mathematical Reasoning. This is where students use their knowledge of Maths to solve real-world problems. We are looking forward seeing some of the colour schemes suggested.
